- We held Second hand uniform Sales each term, each of which sold out. Big thanks to Annie as coordinator.
- We donate thousands in new sports equipment thanks to Rebel Sports, including end of year sports awards, PSSA equipment and sensory equipment for the support unit.

- Pedestrian Safety we continued to lobby Randwick council for improvements to pedestrian safety around the school, presenting again at the Randwick Council meeting and attending numerous traffic committee meeting with the principal. Our continued, consistent and collaborative approach this year saw Randwick Council agree to footpath widening at the back of the school and Transport for NSW agree to a significant extension of the Kiss & Drop zone of Rainbow Street

We should all be very proud of what we have been able to achieve this year and thank you again everyone that helped achieve and deliver for our school community. Thank you to all our wonderful volunteers, teachers and school staff that made this all possible.
